

There are two entrances to the Communities Gallery. One entrance is through the Journeys Gallery. The second entrance is through the Saloon Gallery.



Here we can learn about communities of people who lived in the American West in 1890.

There are cases that talk about the Chinese, European, Mexican, Mormon, African, Native, and Canadian communities.

The museum puts the objects in glass cases to keep the objects safe. While we look at them, we can stand with our arms at our sides, behind our back, or folded in front of us.
